## Dampier to Bunbury Natural Gas Pipeline access arrangement for 2026 to 2030

Invitation for public submissions

The Economic Regulation Authority is seeking public comment on the proposed revised access arrangement for the Dampier to Bunbury Natural Gas Pipeline (DBNGP) for the sixth access arrangement period (AA6) that will commence on 1 January 2026.

On 2 January 2025, Dampier Bunbury Pipeline (DBP) submitted its proposed revised access arrangement, access arrangement information and other supporting information to the ERA. These documents are published on the <u>ERA website</u>.

The DBNGP is one of the largest capacity natural gas transmission pipelines in Australia, spanning 1,600 kilometres from Dampier in the Pilbara to Bunbury south of Perth. The pipeline links the gas fields located in the Carnarvon and Perth basins directly to mining, industrial and commercial customers.

The DBNGP access arrangement sets out the terms and conditions under which DBP will provide third-party users access to the pipeline. DBP's access arrangement information is provided to help interested parties understand elements of the access arrangement.

The ERA will soon publish an issues paper to assist interested parties to prepare submissions on DBP's proposed revisions and highlight key matters that the ERA seeks feedback on.

For the purposes of calculating the eight-month period within which a final decision is to be made, the public submission periods on DBP's initial proposal and the ERA's draft decision will be disregarded under rule 11 of the National Gas Rules.

## Invitation for submissions

The ERA invites interested parties to make submissions on DBP's access arrangement proposal.

Submissions close **Tuesday**, **1 April 2025** and can be lodged online.
