#### **AMENDMENTS TO LICENCE EIRL 2**

Horizon Power requests that licence EIRL 2 be amended to record the boundary changes resulting from the inclusion of communities in the Town Reserve Regularisation Project.

Horizon Power's existing license area in Western Australia regional towns tightly follows our infrastructure boundary. In some towns this is shown by the license boundary ending at the high voltage point to a system owned by third parties.

The Town Reserves Regularisation Project, funded by the Department of Housing (DOH), has tasked Horizon Power to upgrade the electricity infrastructure, including the installation of pre-payment meters, in Aboriginal town reserves. Currently this infrastructure is owned by the Aboriginal Lands Trust (ALT). On completion of works in each community assets are transferred to Horizon Power.

As part of preliminary works Horizon Power undertook network and internal house wiring condition assessments during the second week of August 2009. Due to the general poor condition of internal house wiring, the Department of Housing requested Horizon Power fast-track the regularisation of some communities to ensure the safety of occupants. Originally, Irrungadji and Goodabinya communities were scheduled to commence construction works in late April 2010. Due to a request from the DoH construction work at these communities was brought forward, commencing in October 2009. These communities are now scheduled for completion, along with the balance of communities, between mid November and late December 2009

Communities to be included in Horizon Power's licence are:

Darlungunaya (Fitzroy Crossing)  
Bungardi (Fitzroy Crossing)  
Burawa (Fitzroy Crossing)  
Junjuwa (Fitzroy Crossing)  
Goodabinya / Murtunkurra (Marble Bar)  
Irrungadji (Nullagine)

Enclosed is a CD with amended licence area maps for each of the above locations. These maps replace maps in the existing licence EIRL 2, the licence area for the particular localities being expanded to encompass the new communities.
